



Today was a special day for Ali because he learned how to dial 9-1-1 in an emergency. He was so excited to show his grandparents what he learned.


















Ali asked his grandparents to sit together on the sofa...

But Ali, we don't speak English. If there is an emergency, we will call your mom and dad.





But Grandma, they are at work and I am at school so you are all alone. We learned it's very important for your safety that you call 9-1-1 first.










